

Georgetown College, KY



- Georgetown College was established in 1829.
- Georgetown College made history as the first Baptist college founded west of the Allegheny mountains.
- Fewer than ten students received degrees from Georgetown College in 1832. In 1834 the trustees rehired Johnson, who increased the enrollment.
- The foundation of Georgetown College was secured between 1839 and 1894.
- After the war, under the presidency of Maldon Browning Adams, the curriculum was enlarged to include business, religion, and teacher training.
- Greek letter organizations were temporarily banned.
- In the early 1960s, Knight Hall, on College Street, was also built for women and a new president's home was purchased.
- In 2005, Georgetown College and the Kentucky Baptist Convention redefined their formal relationship.

- From 1829 to 1942, the College had an independent, self-perpetuating board of trustees and was designated as the senior, liberal arts college for Kentucky Baptists until the 1960s, when Campbellsville College and Cumberland College became senior colleges.
