

Wright State University's Information and History



Wright State University is a public research university that was individually established in 1967, but originally was founded as a branch campus of The Ohio State University and Miami University. The student input has always been one of the highest priorities of Wright State. In 1966, the new campus's newest single building "Allyn Hall" was built, offering new amenities for the student body. Offering more than 230 degree programs, and a student body of nearly 18,000. Wright State's application is online and requires an earned certificate stating that you have completed high school, a cumulative GPA of 2.5, and a ACT or SAT score. Wright State's ACT code is (3295), and the SAT score is (1179). Approximately 3,000 of Wright State's students live on one of Wright State's three residence halls: The Hamilton, The Woods, and Honors Community. The cost of living in one of Wright State's residence halls "The Woods," can go from costs of \$2,809 per year for a triple room, up to \$3,385 per year for a single room,

and can vary in between. The campus also has amenities for students all over, including gyms, and even a rock climbing wall in the student union.
