

## Interview Questions:

1. **Name:** Ann Annsberry
2. **Job:** Dental Hygienist
3. **How long at job:** 7 years
4. **Likes:** “Being able to interact with patients and help them learn about brushing and cleaning their teeth(children).”
5. **Challenges:** “Sometimes the kids are a challenge(getting them to stay still, and the actual cleaning of their teeth), but other than that most challenges come within yourself and are based off of how hardworking you are.”
6. **Rewarding:** “I’d like to think that it’s pretty rewarding being able to not only clean my patients teeth for them, but teach them how to keep their teeth clean is also something I love doing everyday”
7. **What has changed in the profession:** “Opportunities for dental hygienists are actually growing more and more everyday. There are so many offices that NEED dental hygienists and assistants to work for them.”
8. **What is continuing to change:** “The amount of dental hygienists in and out of offices, and the amount of dental hygienists expanding their education and working to become oral surgeons.”
9. **What do you expect to change:** “I’m hoping for an advancement in technology especially when it comes to cleaning the instruments(it’s a long process and sometimes is the reason for a crowded waiting room).”
10. **Training/Education:** “High school GED, Post-secondary certificate, associate's degree or bachelor's degree, complete a dental hygienist program(state test), earn a license(pass exams).”
11. **Was it difficult to find work:** “I personally don’t think it was, just because i had family in the medical and dental departments who helped me out alot with letters of recommendation and job interviews.”

15. **Need to know:** “When your professors tell you to order all of the books and give you websites to visit and professionals to talk to, take it. If you’re being offered help in this field, your best option is to take all of it that you can get.”
