

Visiting Kent State University

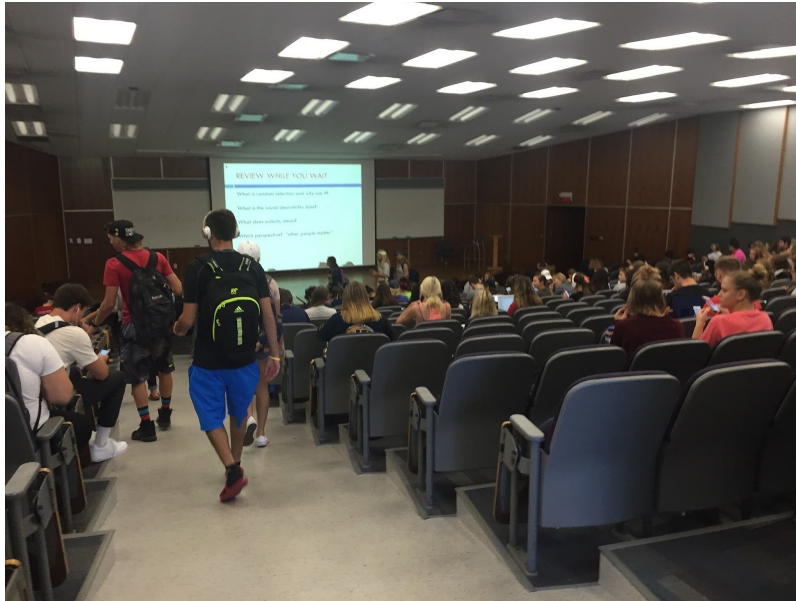
