Wright State University was founded October 1st, 1964 from a decision from the Ohio Board of Regents. Originally a branch campus of The Ohio State University and Miami University, it became an independent university, three years later, in 1967. The name of the university serves as a tribute to the Wright brothers, otherwise known as the two brothers from Ohio that invented the first working airplane.

At Wright State, students applying to the college have two options of meeting the requirements for admissions. In order for someone to get accepted into Wright State University, they would need to have completed the Ohio Core Curriculum, achieve a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 2.0, and achieve an ACT composite score of 15 or SAT score of 740. The second option students have is to complete the Ohio Core Curriculum, achieve a minimum high school GPA of 2.5, and to submit any ACT or SAT score. Out-of-state students have to complete an equivalent curriculum. Students are charged an application fee of \$30.

Wright State University has a total undergraduate enrollment of 12,722 students. 46% of those students being male, and 56% being female. Over half of first-year students live on Wright State's campus. The campus is beautiful and most that come and visit will love every aspect of

the University. That is why Wright State University is a campus most anyone could fall in love with.
