Cincinnati State



The school was originally the Cincinnati cooperative school of technology, a two year technical school. In 1966 the school was changed to be more of a college classroom setup and offer a wider variety of studies. Along with offering more majors the name was changed to Cincinnati technical institute. In June of 1970 the Cincinnati board of education bought the Courter Technical High School and made it the campus that Cincinnati state is located at today.

For the next four years the college and the high school shared the building till the high school moved out. Over the next decade the college more than doubled in size, from 2,000 to 4,000 (76-89) Then in 1990 the school exceeded more than 5,000 students. Since the school had gained in such size the Cincinnati Technical College Board converted Cincinnati Technical College into a community college. Then in 1998 After the college had acquired the Cincinnati West Airport the school began aviation training and schooling.

In five more years the school would grow to over 8,000 students enrolled at the college. Then for the next several years some personnel changes and then open their middletown campus in 2012. Since its opening there are now more than 130 different programs that students can take between the two campuses.

There is no application fee unless you get accepted then it's a fifteen dollar fee to register for your classes. You need to have your transcripts ready and available. Take the college placement test and you are good to go.

Costs are pretty cheap, about \$4000 a semester for instate tuition and there is no room and board because it is a community college.
