The kind of person you need to be in order to do well as a Social Worker is to have **compassion** and be able to work in child welfare agencies, prisons, mental health clinics, hospitals, nursing homes, substance abuse clinics.

You need to have great **listening skills** because you can't help your clients and understand their situation if you don't listen to them. Everyone is different, with different needs and solutions.

Organizational skills are very important due to large caseload of work. The Child Welfare League of America says that each social worker should have about 12 to 15 cases at a time but the average is actually 24 to 31 children at a time. If you're disorganized and can't find a case, you'd be cutting into your client's time. That's why it's extremely important to stay organized.

It's a great field of work to get into if you want to help people, but it's not for everyone.

To advance you can graduate with a Master of a Social Work degree program. You need to get a Master's Degree in order to work as a clinical social worker, and the state requirement is to have a license to practice. To get a license you have to get experience under the supervision of a licensed clinical social worker along with the master degree.

The skills required to be a social worker are active listening, emotional intelligence, organization, critical thinking, tolerance, empathy, good communication, inner strengths.
